ADMIN

Kon-Tiki HQ

The Kon-Tiki HQ will be located at the Nutec Structure by the main lawn. Please note, HQ is only for official competition admin, or for emergencies. Additional queries and general information should be handled by raft and fringe leaders.

Judges

The following is a requirement for each team entered for Fringe:
Each team must provide at least one Scouter volunteer to assist with judging. Each judge is required to participate in a minimum of one judging slot (between Saturday 8am and Sunday 4pm), as specified in the judge sign-up form.

Registration & Teams:

SENIOR TEAMS (under 18 years) - Dolphin Trophy

8 scouts that have not yet turned 18 by 17/04/2026.

JUNIOR TEAMS (under 14.5 years) - Stef Terblanche Trophy

8 scouts that have not yet turned 14.5 by 17/04/2026.

Consent Form Hand-in

Kon-Tiki HQ **Friday 18:00 - 19:00** or **Saturday 08:00 - 08:45**.

Any scout representative may submit this on behalf of the teams.

ON THE DAY:

- A completed cover page
- 8 fully signed consent forms (water activities ticked)
- Consent forms must be in the order the names appear on the cover page

General Information

Behaviour

- Scout Law and SSB rules to be followed at all times!
- Raft/fringe team leaders are responsible for behaviour of scouts
 - TS should support their team leaders to do this
- Using HQ to mediate conflicts should be a last resort.

Parking

- Parking areas can be viewed on the Kon-Tiki Layout Plan.
- Parking staff will designate these areas clearly and help guide traffic.
- Vehicles parked on public roadways or private property could be towed away by the local traffic authorities. NO fringe VEHICLES will be allowed to park inside the base.

Kitchen & Tuck Shop

- Cash and Card
- Open all weekend (see timetable on page 1)
- Proceeds go towards the Sea Scout Base!
- DO NOT LITTER! Bins will be provided.

Safety & Security

Professional security will be present throughout the weekend and can be called in an emergency through any judge with a radio, or at HQ. Personal belongings are your own responsibility, so please be wise with your valuables.

Electricity Use

NO use of Electrical outlets at the Sea Scout Base and the Sea Cadet Base are to be used!

Due to the limited power supply at the base, no cooking or electrical appliances (including kettles) will be permitted in the garages.

- Cooking will only be allowed on gas, but we do urge all teams to support the Sea Scout Base kitchen.
- Generators are only allowed to be used in construction sites between 07:00 and 23:00.

Braais and Fires

Fires are allowed but may only be made in portable braais brought from home. The Sea Scout Base does not supply braai drums, and the base braai area (Cyril's Corner) may not be used during the weekend. Please ensure that you adhere to proper fire and gas safety requirements.

Camping

- Booked and managed through the Port Captain.
- No vehicles or trailers will be permitted in the camping areas.
- Campsites must be left completely empty and clean.
- Campsites do not have electrical outlets or water taps.

Ablution Facilities

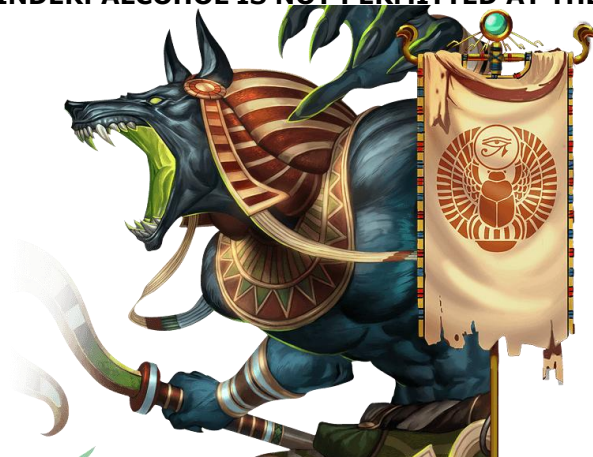
Toilet facilities are limited at the Sea Scout Base so please treat these facilities with respect.

COMPETITION DETAILS

Activities

There will be 6 main activities:

1. Volleyball
2. Tug-o-war
3. Knee Boarding (Water Quality Dependant)
4. Catapult Competition
5. Cross Country Race (Sunday Morning)
6. Wide Game (Saturday Night)

These events will run as pooled tournaments. Teams earn points by winning games, and the top teams from each pool will move on to the next rounds.

Finals will take place on Sunday morning after the Cross Country Race.

All rules, pools, maps, and schedules will be included in the Information Booklet handed out at registration.

Theme Dress-up

Each fringe team is expected to dress up. 2 members from each team are required to wear an outfit that matches their raft theme (for raftless teams, you may dress within the Heroes of Mythology theme)

Points will be awarded for creativity, quality, and how well it fits in with the theme.

- 2 Fringe members
- Judged on Saturday morning at 11:00 in the courtyard
- Fringe teams will be a part of the opening parade

STA's

YOU WILL NEED:

- Cell phone and data
- Your general STA kits which should include - pencils, khokis, paints, glue, pens, paper, etc.
- Newspaper or scrap paper
- Pieces of fabric - old broken clothing, cut offs, rags, etc.
- Cardboard - recycled boxes or pieces of old cardboard boxes or similar
- String (1 roll)
- Tissue paper/translucent paper
- Dowel stick x 1 (1m long)
- Whipping twine (1 spool)
- Bamboo skewers
- Headlamps (1 per scout)
- Decorative items (foil, beads, feathers, stickers)
- Small tealights
- PVA / white glue
- 4x Balloons
- Tape
- 6x plastic Bottlecaps
- You will need to provide your own equipment to build the catapult.

- ANYONE connected to your troop may sign up on the day.
- Points will be awarded per entry, plus more for podium finishers in each category.
- Junior route: 2km
- Senior/Adult Route: 4km
